Museum Director Report for April

- We had 150 visitors for the month of April 2025 from the four state region plus Louisiana, Texas, Minnesota, Mississippi, California and Australia.
- Jeff Terry, Manager CPKC Heritage Services and Operations U.S. and Steven Pawlow a major KCS memorabilia collector from Mississippi visited Carona on April 13th. They both stayed for several hours and left very impressed with the museum. Jeff presented us with two copies of a picture of KCS #488 on the turntable at Pittsburg, no date, from the KCS company archives. This is the 2-8-0 Consolidation steam locomotive that was built in 1906 and converted in 1925 in the KCS Pittsburg shops into 0-8-0 switch engine #1023 which we have on display. This is the only known photograph of the 1023 in it's as build condition. Jeff is wanting to come visit again and look through some of our archives.
- The Fort Scott Christian School on April 24th visited with 38 students from 3rd through 8th grade plus adults. They divided into two groups and spent over an hour at the museum. They didn't set enough time to make a complete tour but were very happy with what we presented and want to come back again. Thanks to Larry and Kathy Spahn plus Paul Morgan for helping out with the tour.
- We had lots of rain, over five inches during a three day period which kept Watco from working on the container project.
- The Thunderbird car club from Kansas City was unable to stop at Carona due to time constraints but they would like to include us in a fall two day trip. Hopefully we will see them later this year.

Old Business:

Museum Replacement Lighting:

The old fluorescent light fixtures and bulbs have been removed and replaced with more efficient LED lighting fixtures. The old lighting system was not only very inefficient but now is not recommended for use in museum settings as the fluorescent light rays cause deterioration of the colors and dyes used in pictures and paintings. The new lights provide about the same amount of illumination for half the cost. Our thanks to Larry Spahn for replacing the lights.

Storage Container:

Wet weather conditions have delayed the completion of this project. When weather permits the container shouldbe completed very quickly.

<u>Visits to the Museum</u>:

As can be seen from the list below we have had several groups visit the Webb Center.

<u>Fort Scott Christian Learning Center:</u> Due to the number of persons in the group they were split into two groups with one group being shown through the Webb Center while the other half enjoyed the outside displays. The groups then switched out so everyone could see all of displays we have to offer.

Columbus Head Start Group:

The group visited the museum on May 07 at 10:00 am. There were fourteen persons, three to five year olds and staff visiting the museum and displays.

Kansas City Thunder Bird Club Visit:

Due to time restraints and rainy weather forecast, the T Bird club cancelled their visit but plan on coming later in the year.

New Business:

Signal Collection Discussion:

Jim McKeel recently called and asked if we might be interested in acquiring a donation of a huge signal collection. He had recently spoken with Larry Toerber who was once employed by the Milwaukee Railroad as a signal maintainer. He told Jim that he had a large collection of signal equipment, relays, instruction manuals etc, etc. After the restructuring of the company, Larry went to work for the FRA as an inspector and after thirty seven years of service is retiring. He will be selling his property and moving in the near future and is looking for a home for his collection.

After the discussion with Jim and Larry Spahn, Jim arranged a visit for that weekend. Larry called Brian Carlson, our treasurer, and Brian said that he was free that Sunday and was willing to drive out and see what we might be getting into. We need to discuss the possible acquisition of this collection. After some discussion it was agreed that the Heartlands would not be able to accept this donation.
